Classroom Expectations

Communication:

-Assignment Notebooks:

To help my 5th graders stay organized they will be using an assignment notebook. It is essential that they bring their assignment notebook to class **EVERYDAY**. Students will write down homework, projects, upcoming tests, and any other important dates. I will be checking assignment notebooks on a regular basis. Every night, it is the student's responsibility to get it checked and **SIGNED** by an adult at home.

-Take Home Folders:

Each student will have a take home folder. Each day graded assignments, notes, and newsletters will be sent home. Please check this folder daily to help monitor your child's progress at school.

-Newsletters:

I will write a monthly classroom newsletter to explain any important events coming up. The newsletters also include what your child will be learning throughout the month. Newsletters will be sent home with your child as well as located on my classroom website.

-Class Dojo:

I will also be using the classroom communication tool, Class Dojo. Class Dojo provides an opportunity for me to share what is happening in the classroom. I will be posting daily assignments and photos of classroom activities. I will be sending home a Class Dojo parent invite so you can view what your child is doing at school.

Daily Classroom Activity:

-Snack Time:

I will have a snack time each day in order to help students stay focused until lunch. Students will be responsible for bringing their own snacks. Please keep these snacks healthy; <u>NO SODA OR JUNK FOOD</u> Students will also be allowed to have a water bottle in the classroom throughout the day.

-Helping Paws:

Each week I will have two classroom helpers. They will be responsible for a variety of tasks including the following:

*Deliver messages/books wherever needed in the school at any time

* Lead our class line throughout the building at an appropriate pace

*Collect papers from students and check for names

*Make sure all the lights are off when we leave the room

*Turn lights on when we enter the room

*Keep the classroom library tidy and puts away any returned books

* Help students make their lunch choices and record totals

*Change the date and daily schedule

*Turn Smart Board on and off

*Make sure all Chromebooks are plugged into their chargers

*Help monitor appropriate Chromebook use

-Homework and Late Work:

Your child will have multiple assignments/tasks throughout the day. I plan my lessons to give students class time to finish assignments/tasks. However, if any assignments/tasks are not done by the end of the day, students are responsible to finish these at home. Unless specified by me, all assignments are due the next day. A student who does not complete his/her work will stay in for study hall during a portion of recess to complete the assignment/task. If the assignment/task is completed in a timely manner, points will not be taken off for being late.

-Attendance and Late Work:

If a student is absent, I will work with them to get their missing work completed. <mark>If possible, it is beneficial to get your child's homework prior to an arranged absence</mark>. I will also be posting homework on my classroom website and on Class Dojo.

-Classroom Discipline Policy:

Good behavior is a daily classroom expectation. Students who choose to follow expectations are rewarded with classroom free time, positive compliments, Class Dojo points, PBIS raffle tickets, and other incentives. Within my classroom, my students are expected to practice safety, act responsibly, work hard, and show respect (PAWS). My students are expected to uphold these expectations at all times. If a student chooses to not follow these expectations, the following steps will be taken.

-Step #1 Are You Above the Line?: The student will have a brief conversation with me about whether their behavior is above the line or below the line.

-Step #2 Fix-it or Consequence: The student will be given the choice to fix their behavior or receive a consequence. If the student chooses a consequence, they will move to step #3.

-Step #3 Think-Sheet: The student will fill out a think-sheet and have a conversation with me. A think-sheet will have the student reflect on their behavior. The think-sheet will be sent home for a parent signature.

-Step #4 Teacher Choice: Depending on the behavior, I will make an appropriate decision on what the consequence should be. Students may miss out on recess, spend time in the office, or have a parent/teacher conference.

-Chromebooks

Within my classroom, Chromebooks are a tool for assisting each student with their learning. It will be their responsibility to use their Chromebook correctly. During the first week of school, my students will receive an overview of my Chromebook expectations and have opportunities to practice the correct way to use a Chromebook. After expectations have been given, I will expect all of my students to use them properly. If a student choices to not use their Chromebook appropriately, I will follow my classroom discipline policy.

Components of Personalized Learning

-What is Personalized Learning?

Personalized Learning places the individual learner at the center of the learning process. Personalized learning is paced to student needs, tailored to learning preferences, and customized to their specific interests. I will be incorporating elements of Personalized Learning alongside the curriculum that is already in place. I will be taking this process slowly with my students so that the expectations are clear and they understand them.

-Flexible Seating

In my classroom I will be using flexible seating or alternative seating. This means that during work time they will have the freedom to find comfortables spaces around the room to work. Students must choose spots that help them learn at their best. Each student will have a desk that they will use to store their materials and receive whole class lessons at. As the teacher I have the right to move any student that doesn't choose the best spot for their learning.

-Student Goals

Each of my students will achieve many goals this school year. Based on student data, each student will be working on specific goals for a variety of subject areas. Through conferencing and student work, I will be able to assist each student in helping to achieve their individual goals. Once goals have clearly been met, I will work with each student to help determine new goals.

In order to help with communication, I will be posting daily to my classroom website, using Class Dojo, sending home emails, and sending home paper copies of upcoming events.
